Major investments in education infrastructure

INVESTMENT OF ALMOST 3.3 MILLION DOLLARS IN THE ÉCOLE GREATER GATINEAU-ST-ALOYSIUS

Gatineau, January 11, 2018. — An amount of almost \$3.3 million is being allocated for the addition of five new classrooms and a daycare area at the Greater Gatineau–St-Aloysius de Gatineau elementary school.

Marc Carrière, Member of the National Assembly for Chapleau, and Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports and the Minister responsible for Higher Education, made this announcement today on behalf of Sébastien Proulx, Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports and Minister responsible for the Capitale-Nationale region.

In addition, last June 13, Minister Proulx announced that all construction or expansion projects involving school infrastructure, in both the general education and vocational training sectors, would begin receiving increased funding. This could be up to 15% of the cost of the work and associated expenses for the implementation of architectural or engineering solutions to support both the educational success of students and sustainable development. Eligible projects include the creation of open and flexible learning spaces conducive to creativity, collaboration and interaction; work to increase available light and sustainable environments in terms of indoor air quality; and systems that minimize the emission of greenhouse gases. Such funding is a concrete way to support educational success for all Quebecers, from early childhood to adulthood.

This investment is provided under the 2017-2027 Québec Infrastructure Plan. For the 2017-2018 school year, \$400 million will be allocated to school boards under the measure to provide additional space for general education. These funds will enable the boards to carry out school construction, expansion and renovation projects, and to acquire buildings or equipment for both the general education and vocational training sectors.

The funding announced today is allocated under the measure to provide additional space for general education, under the 2017-2027 Québec Infrastructure Plan.
