Noranda School has a zero tolerance policy against physical and verbal abuse, bullying and intimidation and the use or possession of drugs and alcohol. Any of these offenses are serious and would result in immediate and decisive action to be taken by the administration in coordination with the WQSB discipline committee.

	Expectations	Intervention(s)
Language	Students are expected to speak proper and appropriate English at Noranda School at all times. Swearing, derogatory language concerning race or sexual orientation or other types of vulgar language is never acceptable.	Students are encouraged and reminded to speak English at school. However, after numerous infractions, a detention may be administered. Infraction (see <i>Escalation of Infractions</i> above)
Regular school attendance	Students must attend school regularly. Student are responsible for catching up on any missed classwork, assignments or homework. In the event of illness, medical appointments or any other legitimate planned absence from school, parents are expected to contact the school before said absence. Classroom attendance is taken every class. In the case of absence, the school will contact parents to ask them to justify their child's absence. Noranda School does not consider family vacations, justified absences. Therefore, teachers are under no obligation to prepare work for students while on vacation or help them catch up on missed work when they return to school.	Students who are absent from class and their parent or guardian has not contacted the school to justify their absence in advance, are considered truant (skipping) (see <i>Consequence for Infractions</i> above).

School and Classroom behaviour	Students must conduct themselves in a manner which respects the rights of other students and staff. These rights include the right to learn, the right to a safe, non-threatening environment, the right to courtesy at all times, the right to protection of private property, the right to have a clean school and the right to hear only acceptable language. Students will behave in a manner that is conducive to learning and will respect both school and individual classroom guidelines.	If a student does not adjust their behavior after being warned by the teacher, they may be asked to leave the classroom and wait in the hallway or report to the office. Depending on the severity of the behavior the student may receive a consequence (see Consequences for Infractions above) or be sent home immediately.	
Dress Code	 Students are required to dress in a manner that is clean, neat, and appropriate to the school setting and the weather. The following guidelines are to be respected at all times. A. Clothing and jewelry shall be free of writing, pictures, or any insignia which is crude, vulgar, profane, sexually suggestive, anything promoting the use of illegal substances, anything that advocates negative racial and /or ethnic prejudice, or is disrespectful to any religious group. B. Clothing should be appropriate for a professional setting and must conceal undergarments at all times. C. Bare midriffs, undershirts, see-through fabrics, clothing with excessive gaping holes, off the shoulder, must not be worn. Skirts and shorts must be approximately fingertip length when arms are held at sides. D. Outdoor clothing or heavy boots which scuff the floor are not to be worn in the school. Shoes are to be worn in the school at all times. All students are required to have appropriate footwear for outdoors that is different from their indoor shoes. E. Hats, caps, and hoods are not permitted in the school and should be removed upon entering the school. F. Pyjamas are not permitted, except for special designated days. 	Students found to be in violation of the dress code, will be required to immediately remedy the situation. Non-compliance with these rules may also result in the student being sent home and/or the confiscation of the item, to be returned to the student at a time deemed appropriate by the teacher or the parents of the student. In the event of a student who continues to disregard the dress code, he/she may be send home and required to return with parents at which time a plan of action will be presented to remedy to the situation.	
Use of School Computers	It is strictly forbidden for students to download any software on school computers. Use of social media is not allowed during school hours. Students will use school computers for educational purposes, as directed by the school staff. Students will not access sites or information which are deemed inappropriate.	A student who is in violation of the computer policy will be subject to loss o school computer use from 2 weeks to the remainder of the school year depending on the offence. Parents will be notified by the teacher. Please note: a student who uses school computers to interfere with other student or staff accounts will automatically lose his/her privileges for the school year, parents will be contacted and a consequence will be given (see Consequence for Infractions).	
Completion of assignments	Students will complete assignments to the best of their abilities and hand them in as requested by their teachers. Teachers will provide students with sufficient time to complete assignments teachers will monitor and keep record of assignments completion.	Elementary Student who do not hand in an assignment on time could be given an extension by the teacher and / or asked to complete the work at lunch/recess. Parents may be contacted. A student who chooses to not hand in an assignment on time should expect a penalty when it comes to marking. Secondary	

		In Secondary $1 - 2 - 3$, 5% per day will be deducted for each day the
		assignment is late for a total of 3 days. On the fourth day, if the assignment still has not been handed in the student will receive zero for that assignment.
		In Secondary 4 – 5, all assignments are to be handed in on assigned due dates. If work is not handed in on time, it will result in a mark of zero on the assignment.
		In the case of justified absences, all secondary students are expected to hand in assignments to their teacher immediately upon their return.
		Plagiarism is a most serious offence. Any student caught plagiarizing any work will receive a mark of zero. Any student may be asked to provide proof of research when plagiarism is suspected. Failure to provide all sources will result in a mark of zero. It is the student's responsibility to keep all research notes/outlines until assignments have been returned.
	Students will restrict use of personal electronic devices at school. School staff will monitor the students' use of these devices. Parents	Students who violate the electronic devices policy will have his/her device confiscated. Device will be returned at the end of the day.
Electronic devices	are encouraged to reinforce the notion of responsible use of electronic devices with their children. At the elementary level electronic devices are not allowed to be used during school hours.	Students who repeatedly violate this policy risk of having their device confiscated by administration for an extended period of time, the end at which parents will be asked to retrieve the device at school.
	At the high school level students are permitted to use their device with permission from the teacher.	Students who refuse to comply with a staff member's request to hand over an electronic device will be immediately referred to administration.
	The school is not liable for lost or stolen devices.	
	Students are responsible for the condition of textbooks issued to them.	Students are responsible to carry textbooks to class.
Textbook	Parents will support the measures that the school is taking to promote learning.	Students who damage or lose textbooks will be required to pay for repair or replacement of materials.
	School staff will model appropriate behaviour; they will monitor and enforce the policy. Parents will be contacted when necessary.	
	Students will respect their assigned locker.	Students who graffiti their locker may be suspended for a period of 5 days and will be liable for cost of cleaning.
Lockers	The Supreme Court of Canada has given the school teachers and principals the right to search students and their belongings if they suspect the student of having in their possession illegal or stolen property. It is the student's responsibility to keep his/her locker locked at all times. The school is not responsible for lost or stolen personal belongings.	Refusal of a search is an automatic 10 day suspension pending a WQ discipline committee meeting.

m Stealing	Students will respect the belongings of others. Under no circumstance is it acceptable to take something that does not belong to oneself. Students will be respectful of all school property. In doing so they will understand that it is not acceptable to vandalize.	A student who steals will be required to repay the amount or dollar value of that which was stolen. The parents will be informed. In cases that warrant it, charges will be laid. The student will agree to take part in a restorative practice session, facilitated by a staff member. Depending on the circumstances, the student may be assigned community service. A student who steals at school or during the school day will be suspended externally for up to three school days. A student who vandalizes will be required to compensate for full repair of the vandalism. Depending on the circumstances, the student may be assigned community service.
Vandalism		A student who vandalizes at school or during the school day will be suspended externally for up to three school days. Regardless of the act of vandalism, the parents will be advised.
Physical Aggression	Students will refrain from any type of physical confrontation.	Two students who enter into a minor physical altercation (i.e. pushing/shoving each other) will be given an afterschool detention. Parents will be notified. Two students who agree to a physical confrontation whereby punches or kicks are administered will be suspended externally for one school day. Parents will be notified. A re-entry meeting with parents will be held.
Possession of Weapons	Students will not have any type of weapons in their possession at school.	A student in possession of a weapon at school will be suspended for ten school days. Parents will be notified; upon return from the suspension, a re- entry meeting with parents will be held. In the event a student is caught a second time in possession of a weapon at school, he/she will be referred to a discipline committee hearing. Refusal of a search is an automatic 10 day suspension pending a WQ discipline committee meeting.
Bullying (abusical amotional cobar)	Students will refrain from any activity that makes one or more fellow students feel uncomfortable. Parents will support the school's anti-bullying policy by promoting anti-bullying at home. School staff will model appropriate anti-bullying behaviour. Staff will monitor and enforce the policy; parents will be contacted if their child is bullying or being bullied.	Any student or students who actively seek out one or more students with the intent of purposely harassing will be suspended immediately for one school day: Depending on the circumstances and the level of bullying, the suspension may be up to five school days. Parents will be informed either way; the student will be required to return with his/her parent(s) at which time he/she will present a plan of action to remedy the problem. The following is a list of examples (although not exclusive) of bullying behaviour: verbal and physical aggression, threats, gossip, intimidating looks, ostracizing, hazing, laughing at others, sending unpleasant notes and/or messages electronically, posting mean comments in chat rooms, blogs, or on sites.
