It was a wonderful event.

Action occurred in all corners of the room as students, teachers and principals were invited to play games, win edible prizes, and vote for their favourite game. Interest-Driven Learning

In Our Specialized Centers!

Fostering success for all students requires a student-focused approach and pedagogical flexibility. Whether in an integrated or specialized setting, teachers supporting students following the CASP 1 and CHALLENGES curricula know the importance of employing these strategies to engage and create success for their learners. WQSB has 5 elementary and 5 high schools with specialized settings that provide targeted instruction to help their students develop a love of learning and the skills necessary to engage fully in their class and school communities.

Our newest Center, at Buckingham Elementary School, is known as THE OASIS. This is not in reference to the rock band from Manchester, England (I've just aged myself), but to the ecological term for a rich habitat supporting an abundance of life. The Buckingham Oasis is a place for students to thrive and for diversity to be nourished. This is accomplished by a team of dedicated educators.

When the students in the center expressed their interest in zoos, the team capitalized on it and addressed student learning objectives through a Zoo-based project. Literacy was supported by identifying animals, learning about their life and habitat needs, and sharing this information with others. Math was made concrete as the students explored animal tracks, counted toes, found patterns, and compared shapes and sizes. Communication, collaboration, fine motor, and problem-solving skills were developed as students created their own zoo (out of paper) and prepared to 'open' it (with tickets) to other students in the school.

The best part about the Zoo project according to Jennifer Payne, the teacher in the Center, was that the students were extremely motivated. The Oasis team just needed to keep up with their ideas, grab a hold of the golden learning opportunities, and share in the students' enthusiasm!

Introducing LittleBits

G. Théberge School

On May 16th, Lisa Diner and Stuart Gray spent a fun-filled day at G. Theberge School in Témiscaming. They introduced elementary teachers and students to a new kit for STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) education called LittleBits from Sphero. These easy-to-use electronic building blocks snap together with magnets, transforming ideas into inventions. They are a fantastic tool for teaching circuitry and electronics in an engaging and hands-on way.

The discovery began with exploring the pieces and the kits. With a low floor and high ceiling, the creations and excitement quickly grew. After the initial exploration, a simple circuit was created, ensuring a power supply, input, and output bits were used.



The LittleBits are color-coded, making it easy to understand what is needed to complete a circuit. Once the initial instructions were given, everyone was free to discover and create on their own.

These introductory sessions used the LittleBits right out of the box with no additional devices required. However, the tool can be expanded by using the fuse.littlebits.com website and connecting to one of the Bits via Bluetooth to enable block-based coding of creations. The best part of the experience for G. Theberge School was receiving a LittleBits STEAM+ Class Pack (containing ten kits) to add to their technology inventory. Thanks to a grant from the Ministry, Lisa and Stuart were able to purchase ten of these class packs this year and will acquire additional kits next year. This will ensure that each WQSB elementary and K-11 school receives one along with an introductory PD session by Lisa and Stuart.


Book Lists

The Mental Health Awareness list features diverse characters and experiences that bring mental health into the spotlight.







